Campaign to save lakes of Malenad

SIRSI: "Rivers, lakes and ponds have contributed a lot for conservation of Western Ghats. Hence, a public movement is needed to save these water bodies", said Environment scientist T V Ramachandra.

Speaking after flagging off the 'Malenad lakes conservation' campaign being taken up by Vrukshalaksha Andolan and Shigehalli Village Forest Committee, at Shigehalli in Sirsi taluk on Saturday, Mr Ramachandra informed that they are planning to hold nationallevel lake convention in Sirsi in November to discuss ways for conservation of water bodies.

dents of Hegdekatta, Bhairumbe and Salkani High School studied about lakes and recorded information on lakes, hills, valleys etc.
