## Annotations

## Item 1. <u>Election of officers</u>

- 1. Rule 15 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council provides that, at the commencement of the first meeting of a regular session, the Commission shall elect, from among the representatives of its members, a Chairman and such other officers as may be required. At past sessions, the Commission has elected, in addition to a Chairman, four Vice-Chairmen, one of whom also served as Rapporteur.
- 2. The membership of the Commission in 1996 is given in annex II below.

# Item 2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters

- 3. Rule 7 of the rules of procedure provides that the Commission shall, at the beginning of each session, after the election of its officers, adopt the agenda for that session on the basis of the provisional agenda.
- 4. In decision 1995/235, the Economic and Social Council took note of the report of the Commission on Sustainable Development on its third session and endorsed the provisional agenda for the fourth session of the Commission.

# Item 3. <u>Cross-sectoral issues</u>, with particular reference to the critical elements of sustainability (Agenda 21, chapters 2-5)

- 5. At its first session, in 1993, the Commission requested the Secretary-General to prepare an annual overview report on progress made in the implementation of Agenda 21, which should focus on the cross-sectoral components of Agenda 21 and the critical elements of sustainability and should contain an analysis of progress made, the main trends, and the main problems countries faced in the implementation of Agenda 21 (E/CN.17/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, para. 28 (a)).
- 6. In accordance with the Commission's multi-year thematic programme of work, in 1996 the focus of the cluster entitled "Critical elements of sustainability" will be chapters 2-5 of Agenda 21 (E/CN.17/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, annex, sect. II).

## Item 4. Financial resources and mechanisms (Agenda 21, chapter 33)

7. At its third session, the Commission decided to establish an ad hoc openended inter-sessional working group on finance in order to prepare for its fourth session. The Working Group was to deal with financial resources and mechanisms as well as changing production and consumption patterns, and was requested to address related aspects of transfer of environmentally sound technology, cooperation and capacity-building. The Ad Hoc Inter-sessional Working Group met from 4 to 8 March 1996. The report of the Working Group will be before the Commission.

- 8. In accordance with the Commission's multi-year thematic programme of work, in 1996 the focus of the cluster entitled "Education, science, transfer of environmentally sound technologies, cooperation and capacity-building" will be chapters 34, 36 and 37 of Agenda 21; the focus of the cluster entitled "Decision-making structures" will be chapters 8 and 38-40 of Agenda 21; and the focus of the cluster entitled "Roles of major groups" will be chapters 23-32 (E/CN.17/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, annex, sect. II).
- 9. At its third session, the Commission, taking into account the need for effective implementation of its functions related to the transfer of environmentally sound technologies, cooperation and capacity-building, decided that the two ad hoc open-ended inter-sessional working groups it intended to establish to prepare for its fourth session would both address related aspects of transfer of environmentally sound technologies, cooperation and capacity-building.

- 10. In accordance with it multi-year thematic programme of work, the Commission will consider in 1996 two sectoral clusters protection of the atmosphere (chapter 9 of Agenda 21) and protection of the oceans, all kinds of seas, including enclosed and semi-enclosed seas, and coastal areas and the protection, rational use and development of their living resources (chapter 17 of Agenda 21) (E/CN.17/1993/25/Add.1, chap. I, annex, sect. II).
- 11. At its third session, the Commission decided to establish an ad hoc openended inter-sessional working group to deal with the sectoral chapters of Agenda 21 under review in 1996, namely chapters 9 and 17. The working group was also requested to address related aspects of transfer of environmentally sound technology, cooperation and capacity-building. The Ad Hoc Inter-sessional Working Group on Sectoral Issues met from 26 February to 1 March 1996. The Commission will have before it the report of the Working Group.
- 12. Also at its third session, the Commission decided to establish an open-ended Ad Hoc Intergovernmental Panel on Forests, composed of representatives of Governments, in order to pursue consensus and formulation of coordinated proposals for action on the management, conservation and sustainable development of forests, particularly by Governments, assessing action already undertaken to combat deforestation and forest degradation and promoting management, conservation and sustainable development of all types of forests, including environmental and socio-economic impacts. The Panel held its first (organizational) session from 11 to 15 September 1995 and its second session from 11 to 22 March 1996. The reports of the Panel on its first and second sessions will be made available to the Commission.

## Item 8. Other matters

### Item 9. High-level meeting

- 14. In resolution 47/191 of 22 December 1992, the General Assembly recommended that the Commission adopt at its first session a multi-year thematic programme of work, including a high-level meeting, with ministerial participation, to have an integrated overview of the implementation of Agenda 21, to consider emerging policy issues and to provide necessary political impetus to the implementation of the decisions of the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development and commitments contained therein.
- 15. At its first session, the Commission decided that, as a rule, its high-level meetings should last for a period of up to three days and that they should be integral parts of the sessions of the Commission and of its decision-making process. The organization of work of the high-level meetings should, inter alia, provide for an open exchange of views among the participants and for the holding of informal meetings as the need arose to resolve outstanding issues relating to its work that required high-level consideration. The result of the meeting could be a concise document, should the participants deem that appropriate.
- 16. Also at its first session, the Commission recommended that the report of the High-level Advisory Board on Sustainable Development, containing its expert advice on issues relating to the implementation of Agenda 21, be submitted to the Commission through the Secretary-General.

17. In resolution 50/113 of 20 December 1995, the General Assembly, recalling its resolution 47/190 of 22 December 1992, in which it decided to convene a special session, not later than 1997, for the purpose of an overall review and appraisal of the implementation of Agenda 21, encouraged participants at the high-level meeting of the Commission to be held during its fourth session, in 1996, to address, <u>inter alia</u>, matters related to the special session of the Assembly.
