### Engineering course fee hiked

He said the private engineering colleges' association had sought a hike of 15 per cent from his department. "The 10 per cent hike happens annually. This time, the private colleges demanded a 15 per cent hike. However, we approved only 10 per cent hike," he added.

The police arrested Anil, a distant relative of Nagesh, for the stone-pelting incident.

## History-sheeter Yashaswini gets anticipatory bail

BENGALURU, DHNS: Woman history-sheeter Yashaswini Mahesh who assaulted a woman for delaying repayment of loan and absconded subsequently, has managed to obtain anticipatory bail.

Yashaswini got herself admitted to a private hospital on Bannerghatta Road, complaining of chest pain and absconded from there. She had moved the city civil court seeking anticipatory bail.
